Notions:

- This pattern was designed to fit over the corseted bustline of the period. If you do not plan to wear a corset, I recommend cutting the bodice out two sizes larger than your measurements indicate to give proper ease
- dots and dashes to help you distinguish between the sizes. The cuffed sleeves were "nested" for the same reason. To save on printing costs, I had to overlap the skirt front and back pieces. The overlapping lines alternate between
- their width (e.g. four half-inch tucks = four inches of fabric times two (front and back of skirt), so eight inches total) If you plan to add tucks to the skirt, remember to add to your yardage amount according to the number of tucks, plus The skirt pieces were made long to accommodate taller ladies, but you can shorten them to whatever length you wish
